How many students do we have?

- There are 5,084 Raymond Walters students attending the college this autumn.
 - In addition to RWC students attending here, 974 students from other UC colleges are also on campus taking RWC classes. This makes of total of 6,058 students on campus.
 - 918 RWC students (18%) also take classes at other UC colleges
- RWC is the third largest college of the University of Cincinnati
 1. College of Arts and Sciences (7,371)
 2. College of Education, Criminal Justice and Human Services (5,199)
- RWC students account for 13% of the University's student population of 40,316

Who are our students?

- Student average age: 24
- The amount of traditional-age students attending RWC continues to grow!
 - The fastest growing student age group is:
 - 19 & younger: up 61% in past 5 years
 - Greatest decline by age group:
 - 30-39 is down by 9% in past 5 years
- Full-time students: 2,968 (58%) Part-time students: 2,116 (42%)
- More RWC students are attending full-time
 - Full-time enrollment is up 10% over last autumn
- 66% of RWC students are White, Non-Hispanic (3,366)
- RWC's student population is becoming more diverse
 - Minority enrollment has grown 4% over last year
 - African-Americans are the largest minority group with 802 students
- Hispanic is the fastest growing minority group with a 32% increase over last year (87 to 107 students)
- 62% of RWC students are female. This statistic has remained fairly constant over the last several years, however it has declined steadily from a high of 70% in 2001
- 75% of our freshmen completed the Federal form (FAFSA) to apply for financial aid!
- Over half of RWC freshmen are first generation college students based on FAFSA data.
- Based on Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) results, 81% of students work; 67% work more than 20 hours per week.



Where do our students come from?

- 91% come from our 4 county service area of Hamilton, Butler, Clermont and Warren counties.
- Over half come from Hamilton County alone (54%)
- Percent change from Autumn 2009:
 - Butler County +10%
 - Warren County -2%
 - Clermont County +8%
 - Hamilton County +5%

- Top ten feeder high schools in rank order:

Student Preparation for College

- There are 1,107 first-time degree seeking undergraduates.
 - 625 took the ACT with average composite score of 19.3
 - 193 took the SAT with an average composite score of 916

- Average high school GPA: 2.60 (100 did not report a high school GPA)
 - 2 students finished with a 4.00 GPA!

- 79 (10%) were in the top 20% of their high school class
 - 302 did not report a high school rank

- 944 students took the English Placement test
 - 609 (65%) tested into college-level English
 - 335 (35%) tested into developmental English
 - 58 (6%) tested into Prep Read/Write I or Prep Read/Write II
 - 277 (29%) tested into Prep Composition

- 1,029 students took the Math Placement test
 - 709 (69%) tested into developmental math
 - 320 (31%) tested into college-level math
 - 24 (2%) tested into Calculus!

- 44% of entering students took at least one developmental education course

C Courses and Faculty

- The faculty consists of 348 members
 - 182 full-time (52%)
 - 166 part-time (48%)
- RWC offers small class sizes and low student to faculty ratio
 - Average class size is 20 students
 - Student/faculty ratio is 15:1
- 733 course sections were taught in 55 different discipline areas
- 448 of the course sections (61%) were taught by full-time faculty and 285 (39%) by part-time faculty
- 199 courses (27%) were evening or weekend courses
- 42 courses (6%) were taught online/hybrid, compared to 36 in 09A representing a 17% increase

C Programs by popular demand...

- 49% of degree-seeking RWC students are enrolled in career-oriented programs and 51% in transfer programs.
- Largest programs are:
 - Nursing
 - Pre-Business
 - Liberal Arts
 - Dental Hygiene
- Fastest growing programs are:
 - Pre-Engineering
 - Pre-Medicine
 - Pre-Biology
 - Computer Tech Support
